WHAT IS IT?

Amnion is a semi-transparent skin substitute that can be used as a temporary skin covering to help with healing and reduce both pain and scar tissue.

AMNION MUST REMAIN DRY & INTACT

Amnion may have a shiny appearance at first, but as it dries, it will become tight and look dry and cracked. The amnion may curl at the edges.

- + Do not peel your amnion.
- + Do not put lotion or Vaseline on the dry, cracked amnion.
- + Do not touch the amnion with your fingers.

Remember, it must stay dry and in place as long as possible.

WHAT TO EXPECT

Dressings are usually removed before discharged. You may be instructed to remove them within 24 hours after discharge. Along with the gauze around your face and head, remove the thin, white, transparent inner dressing that will be on top of the amnion. However, if the transparent dressing is stuck to the area, do not pull it off. Leave the dressing in place for an additional 24 hours until the moist area dries. At this time, it will be easier to remove.



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
